

Public Engagement for Bovey Tracey Community Centre

A week-long public exhibition will take place at Bovey Tracey Library from 27th July through to 5th August 2017 to enable residents to comment on the initial design plans for the new Community Centre being built on the Old Thatched Inn site. Your comments will help to shape the future design and layout of the centre which includes the Library, Information Centre, Public Toilets, Town Council Offices and a multi functioning community meeting space. Plans will be on display at the Library from 12 noon on 27th July and will be available to view during library opening hours.

If, however you wish to speak with a member of the Community Centre Steering group, there will be three separate sessions where group representatives and/or the appointed architects will be on-hand to answer questions. These sessions are scheduled to take place on:

- Thursday 27th July from 12noon to 7.00pm
- Saturday 29th July from 10.00am 12noon
- Tuesday 1st August from 4.00pm to 6.00pm

We want to ensure that the community voice is heard and build a centre that people will want to use. We hope that a multi-use community centre will be able to provide a wide range of services and public facilities all under one roof.

Looking for local, professional office space to rent?

Following community consultation in 2016, residents, businesses and other organisations were asked what they would like to see provided within the new Community Centre building. A number of respondents suggested home worker hub areas/offices as within the rural parish of Bovey Tracey there are already a higher than average percentage of home workers. As we are currently at the design stage, we would like to assess the potential demand for the provision of work hubs within the new Community Centre which, subject to funding, would aim to provide private spaces for individuals/businesses to call their office, whether looking for just a desk to rent, a meeting room for a day or somewhere to base a new business venture.

The building could offer professional, dedicated workspace to use as and when required with no long-term commitments, offering opportunities to meet likeminded individuals and reduce working in isolation at home etc. Another advantage is that offices would be local to home and would help to keep spend local with other support services already on offer within the town. As well as supporting home-based and start-up businesses, proposed work hubs can provide a base for employees who may otherwise have to travel further to work, which offers local business providers the opportunity to walk or cycle to their place of work.

There will be no commitment at this stage or guarantee that office provision will be provided, but knowing there is demand will make a stronger case for potential funding.

Bovey Tracey is a Fairtrade Town with an already impressive range of local shops and businesses which promote Fair Trade products. A pro-active Steering Group, coordinated by Cllr Chris Robillard, is currently working towards refreshing the town's campaign and renewal of the existing status. The first steps have been taken to designate a Neighbourhood Planning Area which will cover the parish of Bovey Tracey.

Bovey Tracey Town Council, as the qualifying body for Neighbourhood Planning purposes, has applied to Teignbridge District Council for the area to be designated. The proposed area follows the parish boundary.

Before a decision is made on the Town Council's application, a period of public consultation has to take place to gauge public support, which runs for 6 weeks until 5pm on Monday 31st July 2017. At this stage, this is not a formal consultation on the Neighbourhood Plan, merely the identification of the potential Neighbourhood Plan Area.
