



### Welcome to Bovey Tracey

WELCOME to the 2020 edition of the Bovey Tracey Town Guide and we hope this guide will provide important local information for residents and help visitors to enjoy their visit to the town.

Bovey Tracey is a unique place - a magnet that attracts visitors from around the world throughout the vear.

Bovey Tracey nestles on the south-east edge of Dartmoor National Park.

Set amidst beautiful countryside,



the town's history can be traced back to Saxon times, with links to the English Civil War as well as the pottery and railway industries.

In 2010, Bovey Tracey celebrated its 750th anniversary of the signing of its Market and Fair Charter by Henry III in 1260.

Close to Bovey Tracey is Heathfield, which is a substantial residential and significant business area within the parish. Nearby is Bovey Heath, the site of an English Civil War battle. Local legend tells that in 1646 during the civil war, Cromwellian troops reputedly surprised Royalist officers who were drinking and playing cards in a house in East Street thought to be Front House Lodge. On making a hasty exit, one of the Royalists had the idea of grabbing a pile of money from the card table and throwing it out



window. The Royalists made their escape,

while the poorly paid Parliamentarians scrabbled for the coins and fled to Heathfield.

The Battle of Bovey Heath was fought the following day with Cromwell winning 400 horses and capturing seven regimental colours. Today, Bovey Heath is a haven for rare plants and wildlife, which is now owned and managed by Devon Wildlife Trust.

Plenty to Do

There is plenty to do in and around Bovey Tracey. A walk around the town will reveal many beautiful and intriguing buildings, including the famous medieval Parish Church of SS Peter, Paul & Thomas of Canterbury, Cromwell's Arch and the Old Railway Station, which is now the Heritage Centre.

Visit Bovey Tracey's Information Centre in Station Road car park, where you will find a variety of leaflets, maps and other information on local places to visit and things to do for all the family, including local walks – pick up a free copy of 'Striding Out' which provides details of six walks in the area – and details of local events.

#### Shopping and Eating Out

The shopping facilities in Bovey Tracey mirror the vitality of the town. You will find a wide range of shops and services to meet your every need.

On alternative Saturdays in the centre of the town, Bovey Tracey's Produce Market is held offering a wide variety of locally produced fresh products.

Whether you want a relaxing breakfast, a quick lunch or a special dinner you can find them all in Bovey Tracey. There are superb pubs, hotels, restaurants, cafes and tearooms each with their own particular character offering excellent food and in many cases accommodation.

Also in Bovey Tracey there are craft shops, a weaver and a specialist wool shop.

#### The Heritage Mosaic Trail

A set of 12 mosaics mark the Bovey Tracey Heritage Trail, a short walk which highlights a flavour of the town's varied history.

#### The Craft Festival

This event has been held annually in Mill Marsh Park, Bovey Tracey, since 2004. It now welcomes more than 10,000 visitors and has become one of the most prestigious and highly acclaimed craft events in the UK. The aim of the festival – formed originally by three local craft businesses – was to showcase the very best in British craft and to create a new, sustainable and strong market place for contemporary craft but also to bring greater prosperity to the town of Bovey Tracey. The festival, which presents more than 200 stands of the finest contemporary craft with a full programme of educational events, is held in Mill Marsh Park, Bovey Tracey every June.

#### Devon Guild of Craftsmen

From small but ambitious origins, the organisation has grown into a leading educational charity and popular contemporary crafts venue at the hub of local and creative communities.

With a reputation and influence that extends nationally, our exhibitions and events are fun, open to all, inclusive and, we hope, inspiring.

At Riverside Mill there are two galleries, constantly changing displays and showcases in the shop and a lively, friendly cafe with free wifi for your personal use or informal business meetings. See www.crafts.org.uk.

#### Proud 2B Here! Bovey Tracey Flag Project 2020

THIS year will hopefully be the seventh year of having flags in Bovey Tracey. Initially funded by Bovey Tracey Town Council and the Tracey Almhouse Trust, this exciting community project enables local businesses and community organisations to create their own unique, large-scale colourful flags that enhance the whole area and make it more attractive to residents, visitors and potential new businesses.

There are potentially nearly 50 large-scale flags going up this summer and we also hope to secure extra funding to allow many more community groups and businesses to produce their own smaller scale flags. This will allow for flags to be put up during major events in the town such as the Contemporary Craft Festival. A flag celebration month will be held over August to show-off the town's vibrancy.

The flags each tell a story about the business or organisation and reflect a sense of place. They are mainly designed and sewn by local people from a variety of local community groups. Flag design and making is supported by the wonderful local community artist Bridget Arnold. The flags are made of colourful balloon material (rip stop nylon) and sewn twice (straight and zig-zag stitches) with polyester thread, with Vilene reinforcement for the pole holder. Pole holders are made by a local blacksmith, and the ash and hazel poles have been coppiced from local woods.

From 2018, Bovey Futures will be helping to secure ongoing funding and sponsorship from local businesses to make it possible for the flags to keep flying as well as looking to expand the project to new places in our parish.



### **Bovey Tracey Information Centre**

THE Bovey Tracey Information Centre is located in the car park in Station Road across the river from the Devon Guild of Craftsmen. In 2020 we will continue to occupy a temporary portacabin until construction of our new home is completed in the community building nearby. The Information Centre is open seven days a week from end March to the end of October and on most Saturdays for the winter months. Staffed by a team of around 30 volunteers, their knowledge of Bovey and the surrounding area is put to the test by some 10,000 visitors and members of the local community every year.

If you need to know about local shops, services and events, places to visit, things to do, where to stay, where to eat, buses, trains, theatres, cinemas, where to walk or cycle, or if you need maps, local books or postcards, then do drop in and see us.

BOVEY Tracey's contemporary crafts venue has two exhibition galleries presenting the best from the South West, UK and beyond. A large shop sells an extensive range of craft to suit all tastes and the friendly café, with rooftop terrace, serves meals, snacks and cakes made in-house

from locally sourced ingredients.

Exciting exhibitions are planned for the year ahead, offering engaging and educational experiences for all. This spring (March - May), Old Skills New Ways will explore creative work by young people made in a series of outdoor camps led by six local woodworkers. This is followed by a Peep into the World of Puppets (May-July) an exhibition exploring the history of this richly entertaining craft using large, silly, old and modern puppets. There's also the Guild Members' Summer Show, A Taste of Japan and the inspirational Christmas show to look forward to!

The café is a great place to meet with friends and family, whether you want a cream tea or a full meal. Varied diets are catered for, including

vegan and aluten free. There's a children's play corner and free WiFi.

Freehand is the learning programme of talks and workshops run by the Guild, placing

artists and makers directly in schools and colleges as part of their charitable work, as well as providing a visitor 'maker space' for every exhibition.

Their educational scheme inspires new communities of makers while attracting wider audiences to the town.

Exhibitions are free and are accompanied by a range of craft and making events including free family activities.

Senior visitors will be able to rekindle memories of past times and children will find their own activity area to help them enjoy the museum.


The remains of an internationally significant 18th century pottery kiln and a restored GWR brake van can also be found on site.

#### Enjoy the natural environment

**East Dartmoor National Nature** 

Reserve (NNR) your local temperate rainforest

The word rainforest conjure up visions of the Amazon, but just up the road from Bovey Tracey on the way to Manaton is the temperate rainforest found in the Bovey Valley and at Yarner Wood and are internationally important.

Here you will find trees of different ages, with healthy canopy (top) layer, understory (middle) layer and ground (bottom) layer plus dead standing and lying wood.

Within this environment a re the, less seen, smaller plants such as mosses, lichens and ferns. Natural England and the Woodland Trust are working to safeguard these special assemblages by controlling shade casting species particularly younger holly and

conifers.

This management is part of the Building Resilience in South West Woodlands project is led by Plantlife and is funded by the National Lottery Heritage Fund.

We equally have the wild river Bovey and it catchment stream, brooks running through these woods over boulders and under dead trees. These and the associated valley mires hold special species.

Open spaces and the internationally important heathland mainly found on Trendlebere make part of the tapestry included in the ecosystem the reserve holds.

Grazing occurs across the NNR. These animals provide the much need structural variation within the ground vegetation, and in winter the browsing of holly trees.

To prevent your dog interacting with animals we ask them to be

on a short lead.

Lots of people use the reserve in many ways please respect other users and stick to the correct rights of way. The ground breeding will benefit less disturbance as will other wildlife.

We hope to continue to impart the wonders of this special part of Dartmoor to the next generation with the help from some our volunteers. If you want help in any way, whether you want to survey the wildlife or manage the habitat please get in touch.

PARKE sits of the outskirts of Bovey Tracey and a five minute walk from the centre of the town. There are lots of circular walks of different lengths from a gentle stroll along by the river to a more challenging walk through the woodland.

A walks leaflet is available from the National Trust office opposite Home Farm café. The café serves home cooked dishes, teas, coffees, cakes and ices and is open all year. Check opening times at www.homefarmcafe.co.uk or ring 01626 830016.

Parke has a fascinating history and clues to its history can be found all over the place.

Major Hole left Parke to the National Trust in 1974. The house you see above, constructed around 1826, was built on the site of a Tudor house, remains of which can be seen in the gardens. The house is currently leased to Dartmoor National Park Authority and not open to the general public. The two rows of granite posts in the parkland, were rails from the



nearby tramway used to take granite from Haytor quarry to Stover Canal at Teigngrace. One of the old trucks used can be seen in the open shed behind the house opposite the layatories.

The weir on the river dates back to

medieval times and feeds the leat, which was built to run a

water-powered mill in Bovey Tracey.

There is an abundance of wildlife at Parke. In the meadows look out for orchids and ragged robin. Along the River Bovey you may see kingfishers and dippers – it is home to salmon and sea trout too. Keep an eye out for otter spraints (dung - you will smell it first!).

In the woodlands, you may see badgers, foxes, roe deer, great spotted and green woodpeckers. Bats emerge at dusk from around the buildings.

Parke continues to be a managed working landscape to support a number of wildlife habitats, a place for people to enjoy and to produce food. The walled garden dates back to the 1800's, when it would have provided soft fruit for Parke House. The ground slopes giving the walls an unusual shape. After many years of neglect it is now jointly run by the National Trust and Bovey Climate Action to produce locally-grown fruit and vegetables, including, apricots, figs, apples, pears, root vegetables,

salad leaves and cut flowers.



The orchard contains 150 cider apple trees. Parke holds an annual apple day early in October where apples are picked and made into apple juice and cider using an apple press.

The dismantled

railway line is used today as part of the Wray

cycle trail.

The Dartmoor Pony Heritage Trust (DPHT) is a registered charity established in 2005 to protect and conserve the Dartmoor Pony on Dartmoor and is based at Parke.



THE 16th century former pub, the King of Prussia, is being converted into a community-owned arts centre with a cinema theatre, an art gallery and artists' studios, and a café bar/restaurant.

The ground floor of the old pub will be an art gallery, and upstairs will be the artists' studios. Behind the pub, outbuildings have been demolished and a 90-seat cinema theatre will be constructed.

Linking the old and the new buildings will be a glass roofed atrium with a café bar and further gallery space.




heritage groups, repair café and open mic.

## The New Century Singers of Bovey Tracey





# Bovey Tracey Athletic Football Club

#### A BRIEF HISTORY

Although football has been played in Bovey since the late 1890s the present club was formed about 1950 by the merger of Bovey Town, and Bovey St Johns who played at the Recreation Ground. This merger was much the work of Frank French, who was at the time the local policeman.

The earliest documented game was on November 11, 1899, when Bovey entertained Torquay United for a friendly in what was Torquay's first season. The game was refereed by a local man who apparently made a series of debatable decisions in Bovey's favour. Bovey took the lead from a dubious penalty and, when Torquay equalised a minute from the end, the referee promptly played 20 minutes of injury time, then awarded another controversial penalty and blew the final whistle as soon as Bovey had scored.

Rivalry with Torquay United extended in to the early 1900s when there reserves were playing Bovey St Johns at Bovey Tracey. The Bovey team were out to win the Torquay & District League (South Devon League) and deliberately prepared a 'hard ground'. The surface was like an iron! An hour before the kick off a Torquay player had a brainwave and visited the local boot and shoe dealer. Eleven pairs of plimsoles were bought and the Torquay team won comfortably. The game gained national press as it was Bovey's first defeat of the season.

Bovey St Johns won the first ever Devon & Exeter Football



League Express Cup in 1909 at St Luke's College when they defeated Bideford 4-0, with goals from Harris, Black, L Marden and T Marden.

On March 31, 1961, in front of 3,000 spectators Bovey won the local Herald Cup 3-1 with goals from Slocombe, Hydon and Fone. Bovey have also appeared in this final, on four other occasions in 1931/32 (Bovey St Johns), 1938/39 (Bovey Town), 1993/94 and 2003/04 all ending in defeat.

In 1979 the football club made there biggest purchase to date with the acquisition of land at Mill Marsh Park (our current ground), however, part of this land was sold under a compulsory purchase order in 1984 to assist in the construction of the 'Bovey Bypass'.

The 2006/07 season was a great success winning the Belli Cup, Runners-up in the Premier Division and semi-finalists in both the Herald Cup and Devon Premier Cup. The 2007/08 season saw Bovey's greatest success to date, in retaining the Belli Cup, winning the South Devon Premier League title, and ultimately promotion to the South West Peninsula League.


Both of these seasons saw Bovey under the guidance of management team of Cyril Gosling, Lee Dorsett and Andrew Paddon.

The 2008/09 season once again saw the club achieve new heights, with the use of new facilities at Mill Marsh Park Ground. The East Division title was lost on the final day of the season but promotion to the Premier Division as runners-up was achieved. We were also beaten finalists in the Devon Premier Cup Final.

The next five seasons saw a succession of managers as Bovey Tracey retained their Premier Division status each season, with their highest position being achieved in 2012/13 when they were 15th. The team with only one win in 2014/15, were relegated back to Division One East for the start of the 2015/16.

With assisted grant funding, floodlights and both covered seated and standing accomadation were installed on the ground during 2010/11. This enabled the club to enter the FA Vase for the first time in 2011-12 when they lost in the second qualifying round to Plymouth Parkway. The club did reach the first round proper in both 2012-13 and 2013-14.

To date, the best attendance at the ground for a competitive game was on April 22, 2011, when 494 watched the 4-1 loss to Buckland Athletic. However, 548, did attend a pre-sea son friendly 6-0 defeat with Plymouth Argyle on July 13, 2016.

2019 was another excellent year for the club having won the South Devon Twinning Petanque League Shield for the 19th consecutive year. During the year the club loaned many of their players to other teams in order to support the league and help them to win some of the trophies.

#### The concept:

The sport is played with metal balls and a jack and can be played by teams of three players (triples), two players (doubles) or a straight head-to-head between two single players.

Ápart from the league completion, BTPC have club trophy competitions if members wish to compete, nothing is compulsory, the idea is to have a fun adternoon.

The object of each end is to get more of your boules closer to the jack than your opponent (each one that is closer scores one point) and the team/player to reach the score being played for first wins the game.

Some of the members also play in a more serious but still very friendly competition in the League



games. The club is open to any one who would like to try their hand at this very easy game played in a friendly competitive manner


