Riverside Community Centre - Update



Towards the end of March 2020, work ceased on site due to the Covid19 pandemic, following which work recommenced on 3rd May and continues to gather momentum. The subsequent revised date that the building is expected to be handed over to Bovey Tracey Town Council is scheduled for 1st September 2020.

Following a competition to seek names for the centre, numerous suggestions were received and shortlisted and considered by Councillors at a remote Full Council meeting in June where it was agreed to name the building 'Riverside Community Centre'.

Saving Devon Treescapes

A proposal was put forward by the Climate Emergency Bovey & Heathfield (CEBH) team for a partnership initiative with Devon Wildlife Trust (DWT) to plant and nurture trees outside of woodlands to replace the large numbers of Ash trees being killed by Ash dieback. The proposal is to plant native species or fruit trees in the council owned Rendells Meadow and grassed area at the junction of Le Molay-Littry

Park Litter Bins



Due to the amounts of excess rubbish being left in Council parks and open spaces, we would like to remind park users that if you're having a picnic or takeaway in the park, please take your litter home. We are unbale to continue to resource the increased waste collection frequency that we are having to undertake at the present time which is incurring additional significant costs for the Council. Separately, the Council will be considering changes to its current waste disposal processes and ways to reduce the amount of rubbish, e.g. bins to separate recyclables.

The Hardship Fund seeks to ensure that vulnerable residents and those in serious need get the support and urgent assistance they require during the Coronavirus emergency.

The Community Kitchen

Although the cafe is temporarily closed to accommodate Covid regulations - other things are happening.

We have set up a Food Hub for the Bovey area to support anyone who needs help with food. Such as a 'top up' delivered food parcel with kitchen staple products such as tea, milk, sugar, coffee, soup, tinned fish, cooking oil, pasta, sauces, rice etc. This support is for single people, couples and families.

We cook, sell and deliver weekly a large range of healthy ready meals and desserts to over 200 regular clients. Delivery of any order of over 4 meals is free. Call 01626 836899. We are a Social Enterprise Community Interest Company so every penny goes back into supporting our members

and ready meal clients through subsidised food where needed.

We are supported in our work by the Bovey Parish Coronavirus Action Group and helped by over 40 local volunteers who prepare and cook the food, deliver it to our South East Dartmoor community, help with our foodbank deliveries, and deliver emergency meals or food parcels.
