2011 PRECEPT - £148,855.00

AFTER CAREFUL consideration members of Bovey Tracey Town Council have set its precept for the next twelve months starting on 1st April. The precept is the amount of money required by the Town Council to undertake its various services on behalf of residents.

These include the management of Mill Marsh Park, the Town Hall, the Cemetery, the Recreation Ground, Play areas, Allotments and other open spaces in the Parish. For the past three years the precept has been maintained at £148,855. This year's total precept will again be the same at £148,855. This relates to an annual total charge of £50.32 per year for a Band D property. Last years Band D charge was £50.33.

The Town Council, in these difficult economic times, is very keen to keep the precept at the same level, with no increases, but to still ensure the service its provides is maintained to the current standards. In order to maintain a balanced budget, the Town Council will be reviewing all areas of its expenditure to ensure parishioners are being provided with an efficient and 'value for money' service.

Teignbridge District Council (TDC) provides an annual grant towards the maintenance of the Bovey Tracey Town Cemetery. This is currently £4185.00 per year. Regretfully, as part of TDC's current cost cutting exercise, this grant will cease from next year. Therefore, in order to address the loss in income, the Town Council has agreed to increase all costs relating to the cemetery by 10% from 1st April 2011. This is a regrettable decision, but the increase in fees is necessary to start to negate the loss of the burial grant from TDC and to maintain the Cemetery to its current standard.

Fairtrade Fortnight 2011 28th February – 13th March

MILLIONS OF PEOPLE around the UK will be showing off their passion for Fairtrade for two weeks. The aim is to get more people excited about Fairtrade and the difference our every day choices can make; from the power of your pineapple to the transformation stirred up by your cup of tea. So far 7.5 million people in the developing world - farmers, workers, their families and communities have benefitted from Fairtrade, but there is a long way to go as Fairtrade accounts for a tiny percentage of world agricultural trade.

The Bovey Fairtrade Town group is hosting their third Fairtrade Primary schools conference on the morning of 7th March in the Town Hall, following their success in being awarded a national award for its Best National Media Campaign during Fairtrade Fortnight 2010 to promote Fairtrade. Primary schools from the area have been invited and are sending representatives. There will be lots of fun and activities about Fairtrade cotton and we hope to welcome a cotton producer from Mali, who can really bring the Fairtrade message alive.

Please also visit the Fairtrade market stall at Bovey Tracey's Produce market in Union Square on 26th February 2011 from 8.30am to 1.00pm which has a wide range of Fairtrade food and crafts available for sale.


