Community Centre - Update

The Town Council, supported by Devon Communities Together, has been busy over the summer undertaking a process of stakeholder consultation and market research to help inform the Design Brief and a Business Plan.

Over 600 local people and organisations have participated in the research undertaken to date in relation to this project to create a Community Centre on the site of the Old Thatched Inn and it's pleasing to note that around 80% of residents' responses support the proposed development.

Capital costs are estimated at present and a Capital Investment Plan has been researched which presents an achievable way forward. Town Councillors considered the proposed Plan in May 2016 and concluded that it would best enable the proposed Community Centre to be progressed with a high level of certainty within an acceptable time frame (built and operational within 2½ years).

A draft financial model exploring the future operational stage of the project has been developed. The model which shows realistic cost projections and conservative income forecasts provides a healthy picture of what can be achieved in the future at the new Centre.

A Design Brief has also been developed which was considered by Town Councillors at Full Council on 19th September. This document was approved and will now be used to procure the services of a professional design and construction team later this year.

To achieve the long term benefits of this scheme, the current Public Toilets at Station Road will be demolished early next year, however the Town Council will ensure that temporary public toilet facilities will be provided until such time as the new Community Centre is built which will incorporate new public toilets

Christmas Lights Switch On

The Christmas Lights switch on will take place this year on Saturday 3rd December. In conjunction with the Carnival Committee, a road closure for the Town Centre area is being applied for, to enable other activities to take place safely on the day.
